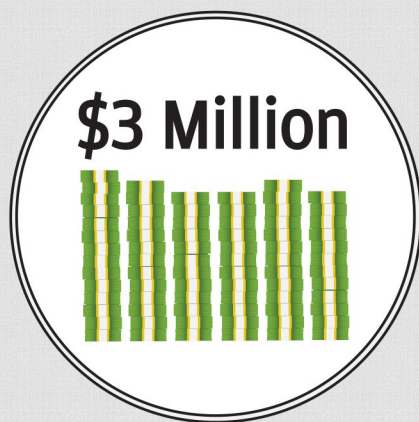


# Ohio Death Penalty Factsheet: Cost

The majority of the death penalty's high costs never appear as line items in any budget. The costs are buried in the thicket of legal proceedings and hours of time spent by judges, clerks, prosecutors and other law enforcement agencies. Did you know that the death penalty is more expensive than other sentencing options? Additional experts, investigation, and evidence are necessary for the sentencing phase; a death sentence requires multiple appeals that can last years or decades; and housing on death row is more expensive than a maximum security prison cell.

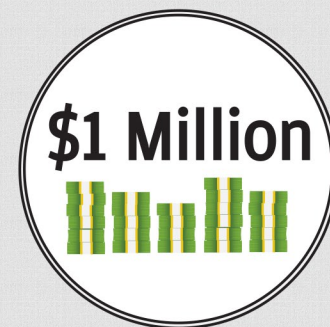
**How much more expensive is the death penalty than alternative sentencing options?**
